How do we get it right?

- We work very closely with our partners from Developing the Young Workforce (DYW) and Skills Development Scotland (SDS). They can provide us with labour market information about where the jobs in the future (in our area) will be.

- We also speak to the young people and ask them what they want to do from S2 to make sure we have courses that are fit for purpose.
- We offer free choice in S2 (within Curricular Areas)


Broad General Education (BGE)





Every year we produce a course choice handbook which lists every subject that is available. This has been sent to you via the school office and is also on our school website. https://drummondhigh.org/information/school-coursing/

<u>Summary</u>

- All pupils will select 8 subjects in S3 (last year of the BGE)
- all curricular areas must be studied (some students will not do Languages but this
 is directed by PSLs and SFL) this is to ensure a breadth of learning across all
 curricular areas
- At the end of S3 pupils will drop from 8 to 7 subjects
- We have provided courses in S3 that ensure progression of skills into Senior Phase courses. This is to ensure pupils do not need to pick up new courses at the end of S3 and have a core set of skills and depth of learning which supports their S4 course choices.
- Students should not pick courses because their friends are or they have a favourite teacher it's about where their strongest skills are and what they enjoy.
